Saving the lives of children with cancer

Every day in the UK, 12 families receive the devastating news that their child has cancer.

In 1988, Eddie and Marion O’Gorman’s lives were completely shattered when they tragically lost their 14 year old son, Paul, to cancer. Just weeks later, they lost their daughter, Jean, also to cancer.

Just before he passed away, Paul asked his parents to help others kids like him. To fulfil this promise, the O’Gorman family began fundraising to help prevent other children’s lives being cut short.

Over 30 years later, those fundraising efforts have evolved into Children with Cancer UK today. We are one of the leading funders of childhood cancer research in the UK funding over 300 research projects. We have accelerated breakthroughs to improve childhood cancer survival rates and find safer, more effective treatments so that one day every child can survive and grow up happy and healthy.

What we do



We invest in childhood cancer research that could otherwise go unfunded. Only around 2% of cancer research funding in the UK* is spent on research that is fully dedicated to childhood and young adult cancer.



We are currently funding over 50 research projects across the UK. We have also funded the Paul O’Gorman Centre, a research centre that has enabled more clinical and lab-based childhood cancer research possible.



We want to make people aware of the impact that cancer can have on young lives. We raise awareness throughout the year, especially during worldwide campaigns, to stand together against childhood cancer and bring hope to young patients and their families.



We support families through their child’s cancer journey. We have co-funded the building of ten patient hotels so that families can stay close to their child during treatment for free.

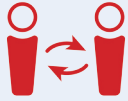

Children with Cancer UK have funded many ground-breaking clinical trials, including the Minimal Residual Disease (MRD) test. The MRD test measures how much leukaemia remains after treatment and how likely it is a child will relapse. This test has enabled doctors to tailor treatments, avoiding unnecessarily intensive treatments which can cause extremely unpleasant and sometimes lifelong side effects. The MRD test is now used in the NHS as part of standard care for young patients.
