About Us

Established in 1987, by our founder, Eddie O'Gorman, following his youngest son Paul O'Gorman passing away from Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia, ALL, Children with Cancer UK has gone on to become a leading force in paediatric oncology.

In the last 34 years we have raised a staggering £290m in the fight against childhood cancer. Over the years, working with the scientific community, we have made significant breakthroughs in the treatment of ALL, and have contributed to raising survival rates from 63% to 84%. Alongside this we have also invested in patient family accommodation and grants to families, in addition to supporting family days out and welfare programmes throughout the UK, helping children and their families to maintain as normal a life as possible during their treatment.

We are moving into a new phase of growth and are investing in our teams to expand our reach, grow our awareness and deliver greater income to ensure we can continue our fight against childhood cancer. Our leading pillar of work continues to be research into the cause, treatment and cure of this cruel disease, and we will not stop until every child survives.

Our vision is of a world where no child dies of cancer.

Since we were inaugurated in 1988, we have been dedicated to fighting the injustice of cancer in children. We raise and invest money for vital specialist research to save the life of every child with cancer.

By funding visionary researchers and accelerating breakthroughs we have helped to drive childhood cancer survival rates up from 63.7% in 1990 to a predicted 84%* in 2017.

We also support families whose lives have been turned upside down by:

- helping to fund the building of free patient and family homes near hospitals around the UK;
- supporting charities offering financial assistance to families during treatment;
- giving children and families unforgettable days out creating memories that can never be lost.

Children with Cancer UK is the leading national children's charity dedicated to the fight against childhood cancer. Our aims are to determine the causes, find cures, improve treatments and provide care for children with cancer.

Role Purpose: This role is to work alongside the Research Grants Manager to further develop Children

with Cancer UK's Research and Grants programme.

Our work started with a promise

We were founded in 1987 following the death of 14-year old Paul O'Gorman to leukaemia and, just nine months later, his sister Jean, also to cancer. Before his death Paul's parents promised to help other children with leukaemia and, today, we fund life-saving research into childhood leukaemia as well as all other forms of other childhood cancers.

- We fund life-saving research to improve our understanding of childhood cancer and to find safer, more effective treatments for all young patients.
- We fund innovative welfare projects to help children and families in their fight against childhood cancer.
- We campaign and raise awareness of childhood cancer, to protect more children and give more young cancer patients a brighter future.

In the last 32 years we have raised over £230m in the fight against childhood cancer. Over the years, working with the scientific community, we have made significant breakthroughs in the treatment of ALL, and have contributed to raising survival rates from 63% to 84% through funding research projects.

Children with Cancer UK is the leading national children's charity dedicated to the fight against childhood cancer. Our aims are to improve survival, improve treatments and provide care for children and young people with cancer.

Main Responsibilities

- 1.1. Children with Cancer UK is one of the UK's largest charities dedicated to understanding what causes children and young people to develop cancer, to develop improved treatments and survival and to provide care for those affected and their families. The Charity's team is dedicated to putting into practice the aims as laid down by the Charity's Aims and Objects under the guidance of the Trustees and members of the Scientific Advisory Panel.
- 1.2. Research within the Charity is undergoing an exciting time as the investment into world class medical research has increased. The Research Grants Officer role is designed to strengthen our research grant management process and the administration of our research portfolio. The post holder will play a supporting role, helping to grow the Charity's capacity to fund more high-quality research. He/she will report directly to the Charity's Research Grants Manager, who in turn reports to the Chief Executive, who carries out the aims and objectives as determined by the Trustees/CEO.
- **1.3**. The post holder is responsible for administering the grant application process including launching funding schemes, processing application review and the routine management of existing grant awards. The post holder must also be available to represent the Charity at external meetings and conferences where appropriate.
- **1.4.** The post holder will be part of the secretariat to the Charity's Scientific Advisory Panel (SAP), organising meetings and equipping them with the necessary information to fulfil their role. The post holder will provide support to the Research Grants Manager to ensure the Charity supports only the highest quality research and that the programme's outputs are continually reviewed maximising the impact of the Charity's research investment.

2. Grants

- Act as the initial contact for active grant holders, dealing with routine enquires.
- Processing and recording of grant payments and assisting the Research Grants Manager with budget forecasts.
- Issue and collect interim reports from grant holders and assist the Research Grants Manager to assess the impact of the research performed.
- Assisting the Research Grants Manager to implement and update relevant best practice procedures to ensure transparent and robust assessment process. Also assist with wider funding policy issues associated with governance.
- Assist in managing records kept on the online grants management system (Flexi Grant) and aid with the implementation of new systems for grants reporting.
- Maintain accurate records both electronically and hard copy.
- Respond to enquiries about the Charity's funded research from the general public.

3. Other responsibilities

- Contribute to achieving the overall objectives of the Charity and support other departments and events where required.
- Represent the Charity at external events in a professional manner.
- Provide support to the Research Grants Manager into any strategically relevant undertakings.
- Assist and lead on the organisation of research related events including conferences and specialist meetings.

 Assist in ensuring the scientific accuracy of internal and external communications around the research programme, for example in feedback letters, fundraising campaigns, newsletters, website content and press releases.
