

Children with Cancer UK Terms & Conditions Kew the Run 2025

Please note that Children with Cancer UK has a limited number of places in Kew the Run 2025, with the 10K taking place on Saturday 29 March 2025 and the half marathon taking place on Sunday 30 March. Places are given on a first come basis. The following terms and conditions apply to those securing a charity place.

- For this event, we require a registration fee of £30 (plus VAT) for the half marathon and £25 (plus VAT) for the 10K (non-refundable and non-transferable) which must be paid upon completion of the charity place registration form.
- In addition, you pledge to raise a minimum of £350 in sponsorship money for the half marathon and £250 for the 10K for Children with Cancer UK, which should be received by Children with Cancer UK by the end of April 2025.
- We recognise that fundraising takes place at different times, both before and after the event itself. However, our experience tells us that the vast majority of fundraising usually takes place prior to the event. Therefore, to give you some milestones to aim for we request the following minimum amounts to be met:
 - At least 75% of your target (in total, excluding Gift Aid) by event day (Saturday 29 and Sunday 30 March 2025) unless otherwise agreed
 - Remaining 25% by end of April 2025

Fundraising will be reviewed regularly to enable us to support the team, however, failure to be seen actively fundraising could result in your place being forfeited. We understand that there are often valid reasons for delays with fundraising due to event plans, so please get in touch (sports@childrenwithcancer.org.uk) to discuss this further if applicable.

- We do not defer charity places over to the next year.
- You will be required to complete a registration form on the entry registration system for the organisers (the 'console'). If you do not complete the form by your given deadline, you will lose your place and will not be entitled to a refund of your registration fee.
- You confirm that you are medically fit and that you participate in the event at your own risk. Children with Cancer UK will not be held responsible for injury or illness resulting from your participation in the event.
- You understand that it is your responsibility to read any terms and conditions issued by the race organisers and to comply with these.
- The minimum age for this event is 18 years old. You confirm you will be the minimum age on race day (Saturday 29 or Sunday 30 March 2025).
- You acknowledge that Children with Cancer UK may incur costs as a result of you joining the Children with Cancer UK Team (e.g. cost of producing and sending fundraising pack/technical kit) for this event.
- All participants understand that any products distributed at the event are subject to availability and may be withdrawn or substituted if necessary.
- As the event is external to Children with Cancer UK, Children with Cancer UK shall not be liable for any loss or damage that participants suffer as a result of taking part in the event.
- Should you, for whatever reason, not take your place, all sponsorship forms and monies collected should be forwarded to Children with Cancer UK or returned to your sponsors.
- You have provided Children with Cancer UK information about you and consent to Children with Cancer UK using this data. You understand that it will be necessary for Children with Cancer UK to share the data with the race organiser in order for you to participate in this event.
- We do not sell or swap your details with any third parties, but in order to carry out our work we may need to pass your details to service companies authorised to act on our behalf. For further information, please see our privacy policy: <https://www.childrenwithcancer.org.uk/privacy-policy/>
- We will keep your details on our database so we can provide you with the best possible support every time you contact us.
- All participants, supporters and spectators, including friends and families who choose to attend the event confirm that they are happy for their names, video footage, photographs taken of them during the event to be used to publicise the event by Children with Cancer UK for commercial and fundraising purposes including, but not limited to marketing material, television broadcasts, social media, advertising, publications, and other documents or mediums that may be made available to the public. Photographs of children will not be used in this manner without express written consent; unless the images are incidental.
