You will work independently in this role to oversee the delivery of research funding calls, develop the charity's Research Strategy, expand research programs and work with external senior members of the community.

The post holder should have a strong understanding of the UK biomedical research environment.

The Research Team is pivotal to ensuring that research funded by Children with Cancer UK is at the forefront of the children and young person's cancer research area. You will have the opportunity to be at the cutting edge of cancer research in children and young people and work closely with members of the scientific community, surrounded by people working towards the same mission.

The post-holder will be responsible for line managing 2-3 members of the Research Team, providing them with support and identifying areas and opportunities for them to expand and develop their experience and skillset.

- Develop and deliver a new Research Strategy ensuring alignment to Children with Cancer UK's overall strategy.
- Implement a patient and public involvement (PPI) strategy for assessment panels.
- Oversee and be responsible for the delivery of research funding calls for research proposals submitted to the charity.
- Oversee the monitoring of research funded by Children with Cancer UK.
- Establish, lead and deliver complex projects, focusing on the development of new initiatives.
- Build and maintain excellent relationships with Scientific Advisory Panel (SAP) to help shape the future of the Research Team.
- Build and maintain excellent relationships with partner organisations, charities and community with an active approach to developing new relationships.
- Lead and develop the Research Team where necessary, identifying new opportunities and ascertaining where new members are required.
- Ensure that work packages in the team are delivered to a high standard and timely manner.
- Be responsible for the Research Team budget.
- Work with the Finance Team to monitor the budget and ensure that all required financial compliances are in place.
- Represent Children with Cancer UK at national and international meetings.
