Please note that you must have secured your own place in the Great North Run taking place on Sunday 13 September 2026, independently of the charity.

- To join the Children with Cancer UK Team you need to provide confirmation that you have secured your own place, independently of the charity. This should be your official confirmation letter or email from the organisers, with your name on it.
- You confirm that you are medically fit and that you participate in the event at your own risk. Children with Cancer UK will not be held responsible for injury or illness resulting from your participation in the event.
- You understand that it is your responsibility to read any terms and conditions issued by the race organisers and to comply with these.
- The minimum age for this event is 17 years old. You confirm you will be the minimum age on race day (Sunday 13 September 2026).
- You acknowledge that Children with Cancer UK may incur costs as a result of you
 joining the Children with Cancer UK team (e.g. cost of producing and sending
 fundraising pack/technical kit) for this event. The objective is to raise as much
 sponsorship as possible.
- All participants understand that any products distributed at the event are subject to availability and may be withdrawn or substituted if necessary.
- As the event is external to Children with Cancer UK, Children with Cancer UK shall not be liable for any loss or damage that participants suffer as a result of taking part in the event.
- Should you, for whatever reason, not take your place, all sponsorship forms and monies collected should be forwarded to Children with Cancer UK or returned to your sponsors.
- You have provided Children with Cancer UK information about you and consent to Children with Cancer UK using this data. You understand that it will be necessary for Children with Cancer UK to share the data with the race organiser in order to participate in this event.
- We do not sell or swap your details with any third parties, but in order to carry out our
 work we may need to pass your details to service companies authorised to act on our
